About The Center

Founded in 1968, the Center for Integrative Counseling and Psychology provides high-quality, accessible counseling and psychological services that honor the role of faith in people's lives. For more than 55 years, we have supported individuals and families through life's challenges by offering accessible mental health care, community counseling, and outreach programs. The Center provides out-patient counseling and psychological services at our Central Office in Dallas well as multiple Network Offices located across North and Central Texas including Waxahachie and Waco.

One innovative program of The Center, Partnerships for Accessible Counseling and Training Program (PACT), engages collaboration with established nonprofits to provide community mental health services to clients who would not have access to mental health care. PACT removes barriers and makes professional counseling and psychological assessments accessible to all.

Program Description

The Postdoctoral Fellowship in Clinical Psychology at The Center for Integrative Counseling and Psychology provides comprehensive training in general clinical psychology through services provided to diverse populations in out-patient settings. Fellows are trained through a focus on direct clinical services utilizing evidence-based practices (including a diversity of theoretical orientations). These skills are developed through multidisciplinary experiences in assessment, intervention, supervision, and consultation. Multicultural competence and ethics are emphasized in all areas of training.

Supervision and Clinical Advancement

Supervision is provided by Licensed Psychologists on staff at The Center. Additionally, a full range of educational opportunities will be provided including weekly case consultation and didactics/continuing education. The fellow is also expected to develop a research project (or similar capstone paper) for presentation



and/or publication during their fellowship year and will have other opportunities for teaching and training.

This fellowship meets all requirements for Texas State Licensure and is comprised of a minimum of 1500 hours over a 12-month period. At the completion of the training year, fellows will be prepared for licensure and independent practice. Additionally, per availability, fellows may be invited to apply for staff positions upon completion of their fellowship.

Pay and Benefits

Pay is commission based on revenue collected for therapy and/or assessments.

Commission Rate: 60%

Expected Salary Range: 45K-55K
